OBSERVANCE OF THE LENTEN DISCIPLINE

Brothers and sisters in Christ, every year at the time of the Christian Passover we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus, the Christ.

Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our life in the paschal mystery.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance,

and for the mercy and forgiveness

proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus the Christ.

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes. This ancient sign speaks of the frailty and uncertainty of

human life,

and marks the penitence of this community.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of Jesus,

to observe a holy Lent

by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by works of love, and by reading and meditating on the Word of God.

Join me as we bow our heads before God, our Creator and Redeemer,

and in a time of silence confess our sin.

LITANY OF PENITENCE

Let us pray.

Holy and merciful God, we confess to you and to one another that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart, mind, and strength.

We have not loved our neighbors as you call us to.

We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

Have mercy on us, O God.

We have not listened to your call to serve as Jesus served us.

We have not been true to the mind of the Christ.

We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

Have mercy on us, O God

we confess to you all our past unfaithfulness: the pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives, our self-indulgent appetites and ways and our exploitation of other people,

we confess to you, O God

our anger at our own frustration and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves. our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work,

we confess to you, O God.

Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the faith that is in us,

we confess to you, O God.

Accept our repentance for the wrongs we have done. For our neglect of human need and suffering and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

accept our repentance, O God.

For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,

accept our repentance, O God.

For our waste and pollution of your creation and our lack of concern for those who come after us, accept our repentance, O God.

Restore us, O God and let your anger depart from us.

Hear our prayer, Lord and Savior,

Creator of us all,

for your mercy and love are ever present for your people.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. May these ashes be for us a sign of our mortality and penitence, and a reminder that only by your gracious gift are we given everlasting life through Jesus Christ our Savior.

Amen.

If you wish to receive the ashes as a sign of repentance and forgiveness, please come forward. Those who prefer not to receive the ashes, please remain seated in silent prayer until the imposition of the ashes in complete.
