### THE LIGHTING OF THE THIRD ADVENT CANDLE

#### \*LITANY FOR ADVENT<sup>ii</sup>

One: O Wisdom, coming forth from the mouth of the Most High, pervading and permeating all creation, you order all things with strength and gentleness: Come now and teach us the way to salvation.

**All: Come, Lord Jesus.**

One: O Adonai, Ruler of the house of Israel, you appeared in the burning bush to Moses and gave him the law on Sinai: Come with outstretched arm to save us.

**All: Come, Lord Jesus.**

One: O Root of Jesse, rising as a sign for all the peoples, before you earthly rulers will keep silent, and nations give you honor: Come quickly to deliver us.

**All: Come, Lord Jesus.**

One: O Key of David, Scepter over the house of Israel, you open and no one can close, you close and no one can open: Come

to set free the prisoners who live in darkness and the shadow of death.

**All: Come, Lord Jesus.**

One: O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, Sun of justice: Come, shine on those who live in darkness and in the shadow of death.

**All: Come, Lord Jesus.**

One: O Ruler of the nations, Monarch for whom the people long, you are the Cornerstone uniting all humanity: Come, save us all, whom you formed out of clay.

**All: Come, Lord Jesus.**

One: O Immanuel, our Sovereign and Lawgiver, desire of the nations and Savior of all: Come and save us, O Lord our God.

**All: Come, Lord Jesus.**

One: God of grace, ever faithful to your promises, the earth rejoices in hope of our Savior's coming and looks forward with longing to his return at the end of time. Prepare our hearts to receive him when he comes, for he is Lord forever and ever. Amen.

Do not hide your face from us, but continue to show us favor. Amen.

#### \*ASSURANCE OF PARDON

The Apostle Paul also writes that the one who calls us, the God of peace, is faithful and will sanctify us entirely. He will prepare our spirit and soul and body to be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord. Follow him and his ways, and know that you are forgiven. Amen.

#### PASTORAL PRAYER AND LORD'S PRAYER

#### \*CONFESSION OF FAITH *Heidelberg Catechism* (Question 65-68)

One: It is through faith alone that we share in Christ and all his benefits: where then does that faith come from?

**Many:** The Holy Spirit produces it in our hearts by the preaching of the holy gospel, and confirms it by the use of the holy sacraments.

One: What are sacraments?

**Many:** Sacraments are visible, holy signs and seals. They were instituted by God so that by our use of them he might make us understand more clearly the promise of the gospel, and seal that promise. And this is God's gospel promise: to grant us forgiveness of sins and eternal life by grace because of Christ's one sacrifice accomplished on the cross.

One: Are both the word and the sacraments then intended to focus our faith on the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross as the only ground of our salvation?

**Many:** Yes! In the gospel the Holy Spirit teaches us and by the holy sacraments confirms that our entire salvation rests on Christ's one sacrifice for us on the cross.

One: How many sacraments did Christ institute in the New Testament?

**Many:** Two: holy baptism and the holy supper.
