*CORPORATE PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Almighty and merciful God, John writes in Revelation that he looked, and there before him was “a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages,” standing before God’s throne and before the Lamb worshipping him. While we long for the Kingdom of Heaven, we fall very short of making it true in our world today. Our nation, the church in its history, and each of us have excluded people inappropriately. We have a tendency to associate with people who think like us, look like us, and behave like us. We have excluded people with different abilities, different skin colors, different national origins, and a multitude of other factors. Forgive our shortsightedness, and renew our hearts that we might look for all to include in your kingdom as it comes into existence here on earth. We pray this in the name of the one who came down from heaven in human form — a nature very different from his own — to lead, teach, and bring salvation to each of us. Amen.

*ASSURANCE OF PARDON

John writes in his epistle, “See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are... Beloved, we are God’s children now; what we will be has not been yet revealed.” Receive God’s love and into God’s family. Repent and know that you are forgiven. Amen.

PASTORAL PRAYER AND LORD’S PRAYER

*CONFESSION OF FAITH *Heidelberg Catechism* (Question 50-52)

One: Why the next words {in the creed}: “and is seated at the right hand of God”?

Many: Because Christ ascended to heaven to show there that he is head of his church, the one through whom the Father rules all things.

One: How does this glory of Christ our head benefit us?

Many: First, through his Holy Spirit he pours out gifts from heaven upon us his members. Second, by his power he defends us and keeps us safe from all enemies.

One: How does Christ’s return “to judge the living and the dead” comfort you?

Many: In all distress and persecution, with uplifted head, I confidently await the very judge who has already offered himself to the judgment of God in my place and removed the whole curse from me. Christ will cast all his enemies and mine into everlasting condemnation, but will take me and all his chosen ones to himself into the joy and glory of heaven.

One: What further benefit do we receive from Christ’s sacrifice and death on the cross?

Many: By Christ’s power our old selves are crucified, put to death, and buried with him, so that the evil desires of the flesh may no longer rule us, but that instead we may offer ourselves as a sacrifice of gratitude to him.

PRAYER OF DEDICATION (IN UNISON)

Gracious God, you love us so that despite our sinfulness, you are willing to call us children of God. Despite the state of your fallen creation — a creation you intended for beauty and harmony — you are working to redeem and restore it such that the effects of sin we experience today will be no more. 
