"Blessings Unrealized" Sunday, November 2, 2025

Read Romans 8: 26-28

"We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

---Romans 8:28 (NIV)

I first noticed something was wrong with my oldest sister when she was 65 years old. I received a thank-you card for her retirement gift and didn't recognize her handwriting. That was the first sign of her dementia, followed by many inexplicable decisions she would make in the coming years.

Our family worried about her living alone. She could no longer drive, shop for groceries, or do her own laundry. She refused to go to the doctor. When she had a stroke and got weaker, she was no longer able to care for herself so we moved her into a care facility. This was the same home our mother had moved to when she was of sound mind at age 93. And now my sister was living there. She was just 73.

In my heartbreak, I asked God to help me see some good in this situation. Soon God helped me accept my sister's dementia and showed me the blessings we had all been given. I realized that my sister was now in a clean, warm place, receiving nourishing meals, and cared for by a kind staff. She got medical attention when she needed it, and we no longer had to worry about her living alone. My sadness for my sister had made me overlook God's blessings, but I received comfort when I recognized how faithfully God had blessed her and us.

Prayer: "Dear heavenly Father, when life is hard and sadness overwhelms us, remind us of your promise that with you all things work for our good because of your love for us." Amen.
