PRELUDE

PRAYER OF PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

(for silent prayer during the prelude)

Teach us, good Lord, to serve you as you deserve; to give and not to count the cost; to fight and not to heed the wounds; to toil and not to seek for rest; to labor and not to ask for any reward, save that of knowing that we do your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord.ⁱ **Amen.**

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND GREETING

*CALL TO WORSHIP (from Psalm 86)

One: There is none like you among the gods, O Lord,

All: nor are there any works like yours.

One: All the nations you have made shall come and bow down before you, O Lord,

All: and shall glorify your name.

One: For you are great and do wondrous things;

All: you alone are God. Let us worship God.

HYMN OF PRAISE: “Blessed Jesus, at Your Word” #454

*ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Our scriptures assure us that our old selves have been crucified with Christ so that the body of sin might be destroyed and so that we can live no longer enslaved to sin. God is faithful, as we confess our sins, repent, and follow Jesus, know that we are forgiven. Amen.

*CONFESSION OF FAITH *Heidelberg Catechism* (Questions 1-2)

One: What is your only comfort in life and in death?

Many: That I am not my own, but belong — body and soul, in life and in death — to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ. He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; in fact, all things must work together for my salvation. Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.

One: What must you know to live and die in the joy of this comfort?

Many: Three things: first, how great my sin and misery are; second, how I am set free from all my sins and misery; third, how I am to thank God for such deliverance.

Almighty God, who knows us better than you? You knew us before we were born. Even the hairs on our heads are known to you. Our thanks go to our lay reader Karen Burditt, soloist Marie Ahmed and organist Ernestine Olson.


We will celebrate the Lord's Supper next **Sunday, June 28th** as well as **Sunday, July 19th** and **Sunday, August 16th**.
