WEDNESDAY NIGHT CHILDREN & YOUTH PROGRAM UPDATE

Everyone enjoyed our Youth Worship Service on December 14th. The students shared in reading scriptures, sharing songs, and even played chimes to accompany the congregation in singing "Joy to the World."

We had to postpone our visit to the Extended Care and our Christmas party on December 17th due to the windstorm and power outage at the church. We will have a New Year's party on January 7th instead. We look forward to seeing everyone in 2026.



<u>TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE</u>

We have exciting news from the Technology Committee! The session approved an upgrade to our very outdated sound system that has been so problematic in the last year. It was determined that the intermittent problems with our sound system were most likely due to aging components that needed to be replaced. These sensitive electrical units have a finite lifespan and our components are well beyond their expiration date. We have contracted with Electric City Sight and Sound from Great Falls to replace the components of our sound system that are most likely to be problematic but keep some components that still have good operational life. In this upgrade to our system we have some exciting new additions! In keeping with our mission statement to reach our community with the gospel, it was decided that we must start live-streaming our services on Facebook and our church website. Today's generation is technology oriented and in order to reach them, we must approach them where they are. This necessitates new strategies for ministry that must include video streaming. This is how the new generations receive information and we need to get on board to keep the message of the gospel alive and relevant. In keeping with this new vision for ministry and outreach, it was decided to upgrade our system to include 2 new video cameras and the computer system needed to operate them professionally. This will allow us to create professional grade video of our services that could attract many who may not ever consider stepping foot inside our church. The potential for this ministry is huge and quite exciting! We hope to engage our high school youth to operate the system each Sunday and thereby directly utilize their talents in service to the Lord in the church. The potential for direct engagement of our youth in ministry through technology is particularly exciting! And finally, we will be installing a new technology called "Auracast" that is the new standard for broadcasting sound to those with hearing aids through the newest innovations in Bluetooth technology. Unfortunately, not all hearing aids are compatible as of yet, but many already are or simply require a software upgrade from the hearing aid provider. All new hearing aids currently being manufactured will be compatible with the Auracast system as it is the new standard for meeting the needs of the hearing impaired in public spaces. Our new system is set for installation in January! We have so much to look forward to in our church. God has great plans for our congregation. He has given us life, vision, and purpose and through this we will continue to work and thrive. Praise God!

NEWS FROM GLACIER CAMP AND SPRUCE LODGE

A Living Hope - Peter and his Epistles: An Epiphany On-Line Bible Study will begin January 11th, 2026 at 5:00PM. Both the actual person and his adventures/misadventures as Jesus' disciple and the two New Testament books attributed to him will be the focus of our exploration.

Winterfest returns to Glacier Camp, February 6th-8th, 2026 after a two-year hiatus. The theme for Winterfest is the same theme that will be explored during our Summer Camp season, "Celebrating God's Gift of Abundant Life." Middle and High School youth will join us starting at 7:00PM on Friday evening, February 6th for fun, games, fellowship,

and sharing. On Saturday, the retreaters will have two options: Skiing at Blacktail or participating in outdoor games and activities at the camp. The cost will be \$200/person with a discounted price of \$175 for groups of five or more. Adult chaperones can come at no cost. Scholarships are available. 
