Let us confess our sin, ask God’s forgiveness, and trust in his
sanctification.

*SILENT PRAYER OF CONFESSION

*CORPORATE PRAYER OF CONFESSIONⁱⁱⁱ

**God of grace and truth, in Jesus Christ you came among us as
light shining in darkness. We confess that we have not
welcomed the light, or trusted good news to be good. We have
closed our eyes to glory in our midst, expecting little, and
hoping for less. Forgive our doubt, and renew our hope, so that
we may receive the fullness of your grace, and live in the truth
of Christ the Lord. Amen.**

*ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Paul also shares, “In Jesus we have redemption through his blood,
the forgiveness of our trespasses according to the riches of his grace
that he lavished upon us.” Repent of your sin, and take comfort in
God’s forgiveness and redemption. Amen.

PASTORAL PRAYER AND LORD’S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy Kingdom
come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we
forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us
from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory,
forever. Amen.

*CONFESSION OF FAITH *Heidelberg Catechism* (Question 69-71)

One: How does baptism remind and assure you that Christ’s one
sacrifice on the cross benefits you personally?

**Many: In this way: Christ instituted this outward washing
and with it promised that, as surely as water washes
away the dirt from the body, so certainly his blood and
his Spirit wash away my soul’s impurity, that is, all my
sins.**

One: What does it mean to be washed with Christ’s blood and
Spirit?

**Many: To be washed with Christ’s blood means that God, by
grace, has forgiven our sins because of Christ’s blood
poured out for us in his sacrifice on the cross. To be
washed with Christ’s Spirit means that the Holy Spirit
has renewed and sanctified us to be members of Christ,
so that more and more we become dead to sin and live
holy and blameless lives.**

One: Where does Christ promise that we are washed with his blood and Spirit as surely as we are washed with the water of baptism?

Many: **In the institution of baptism, where he says: “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” [Also, where he says,] “The one who believes and is baptized will be saved; but the one who does not believe will be condemned.” This promise is repeated when Scripture calls baptism “the water of rebirth” and the washing away of sins.**

PRAYER OF DEDICATION (IN UNISON)

Gracious God, you gave us the Law to show us our sin, Christ Jesus to show how humans might live without sin, and the Holy Spirit to reside within us and guide us through a Christian life. You free us from sin through the blood of Jesus Christ. Continue to grow us in faithfulness and holiness. We return a portion of what you have given us for the work of your church on earth. Guide our Session to invest it according to your will. Amen.
