#### **SUNDAY MORNING ADVENT CLASS**

The Sunday Morning Bible Class, will begin an Advent study on November 30th. It will be the first Sunday in a 4 week video and discussion study titled, "Heaven and Earth and the Incarnation" by Will Willimon. The author and presenter is a retired United Methodist bishop and serves as Professor of the Practice of Christian Ministry and Director of the Doctor of Ministry program at Duke Divinity School in Durham, NC.

To quote the information on the back of his book, "What we need is a God who refuses to be trapped in eternity, a God who not only cares about us, but is willing to show up among us and do something with us, here and now." In this study, Will Willimon introduces us to the God who does just that, bringing heaven to earth and changing everything.


